Planning Law Update

Mon 6 March- Eversheds-Sutherland, Manchester

An essential CPD event for all planning professionals in the region, this conference will provide you with a thorough and thought provoking examination on the latest development, legislative and case law changes providing an update on the previous twelve months and looking forward to anticipated changes.

Natural Environment

Wed 29 March, DLA Piper, Manchester

This event will examine how Environment Act measures such as the Nature Recovery Network, Local Nature Recovery Strategies, and Biodiversity Net Gain will be embedded in the Planning system through amendments and updates to the Town & Country Planning Act (1990) and the National Planning Policy Framework, including policy and project case studies.

Delivering Strategic Sites Wed 10 May, 1 Mann Island, Liverpool

Planning for and delivering strategic residential schemes (1000+ homes) can be very challenging. This event will set out practical tools for approaching the task, including strategic planning, community engagement, legal mechanisms and viability considerations. Speakers will include those from the public and private sectors, referring to their experience and case studies.

Rural Update (Joint with NE)

Wed 7 June, People First Conference Centre, Carlisle

Understanding the impacts of issues such as climate change, biodiversity, food and energy production and the vital role rural areas have in addressing them is crucial to planning for a sustainable future. We'll explore recent trends and changes affecting designated landscapes, the wider countryside and rural communities.

Preparing for Public Inquiries

Mon 19 June, Pinsent Masons, Manchester

The event will consider Inquiry procedures with specific emphasis on the role and approach to giving witness evidence. The event aims to help those preparing for giving evidence at an Inquiry as well as those involved in the management of the Inquiry. The event will feature a Mock Inquiry in order to demonstrate the good and bad of giving evidence as well as some of the "tricks of the trade" employed by barristers in examining witnesses.

Development Management Update

Tues 12 Sept, Hotel Football, Old Trafford

This event will provide an update on the DM issues currently facing the profession; it will look at good practice in development management, deliver a legal update and provide a commentary on practice and procedure. Recent case law and development management decisions will be explored and examined together with the implications for development management.

Delivering Town and City Regeneration

Thurs 5 Oct, The Exchange, Preston

Regeneration is back in vogue ... Our town and city centres have faced exponential challenges in recent years, as planners we need to be equipped with the skills to deliver an end-to-end approach. This session brings together speakers from the public and private sectors covering place-based regeneration, design and heritage, masterplanning, affordable housing and a site visit.

Minerals Planning

Thurs 19 Oct, Crewe Alexandra Football Club

Demand projections for GB suggest that 277 to 323 million tonnes of aggregates will be needed each year by 2035. Against a backdrop of declining reserves, is the Government's recent publication of a critical minerals strategy just tinkering around the edges or does strategic planning for all essential minerals in the UK need a radical rethink.

Viability in Planning

Thurs 2 Nov, DLA Piper, Manchester

Focussing on viability in planning, this conference will bring together speakers from the public and private sectors, sharing their experiences and offering practical guidance on a range of topics including legislative and planning policy updates; land purchase and site valuation considerations; development and viability at the design stage; and viability in decision making.

Net Zero

This event will look at how planners can help to deliver a net zero future. It will provide case studies and practical examples of how this can be delivered through policies and developments.
